Information for Students with Medical Conditions

If you have a child that has been diagnosed with asthma and carries an inhaler in their bag at school it is essential you provide the school with a current asthma plan. You will also be required to complete a 'Request for student to carry his/her own asthma reliever medication" form. This form is available from the school administration office.

If you have a child that requires temporary medication administered for short term conditions (i.e. antibiotics or pain relief) you must complete an 'Administering Temporary Medication Request' form which details the medication and dosage. Medication must be provided in its original packaging, and in the case of prescribed medication must have the original pharmacist labelling with the student's name and dosage. No medication can be administered by school staff unless these conditions are met. Medication times are at 12.00 pm daily. Also, it is the responsibility of parents / students to collect the temporary medication each day.

School Administration Office Hours

The school administration office hours are 8:30 am to 3:15 pm daily. The office is closed outside of these hours.

Stage 2 Dance

Westport Primary School has been fortunate to have Ngioka Bunda-Heath teach a dance routine for our Stage 2 Dance Group with dance co-ordinator Mrs Slade this week. The group consists of both Aboriginal and Non-Aboriginal students. Many of the Aboriginal students have previously performed traditional Aboriginal Girls and Boys Dance at School events such as in NAIDOC Week.

Ngioka Bunda-Heath is of the Birpai, Wakka Wakka and Nugi Peoples. She has trained in both traditional and contemporary forms of dance, the latter including Hip Hop. Ngioka was thrilled to take the opportunity of teaching and dancing with the students of Westport Public School, on her Paternal Country.


